



The Double Bachelor in Philosophy and Sociology is an exclusive three-year degree taught in French, that offers students the opportunity to work in a wide range of fields.

The curriculum combines the two majors (Philosophy and Sociology) with minors in social sciences, such as Political Science, Economics, Geopolitics, International Relations, Public Policy and History, in a path called Politics and Society. It gives students the opportunity to thoroughly and rigorously learn about ethics, politics and social phenomena through the perspectives of philosophy and social sciences.

The major in Philosophy emphasises epistemological questions regarding the conditions of scientific objectivity and the way social sciences differ from natural sciences. It explores moral and political issues including classic topics such as justice, democracy, freedom, equality and social pact, and theory of action (rational choice theory). It allows students to question the theoretical foundations of key political, economical and social issues.

The major in Sociology emphasises the link between sociological theory and empirical research as well as the methodological issues underlying social scientific research, introducing students to the methods of social science survey. It focuses on the political and social changes in contemporary societies within the context of globalisation, such as migrations, urban phenomena or social and cultural inequalities.

This double curriculum provides students with a deep and comprehensive understanding of the functioning of contemporary societies, and challenges them to think critically about key sociological and philosophical issues.

A mandatory language course offers students the opportunity to add an extra language to their skills. These language choices include Arabic, English, German, Italian, Chinese or Spanish.

The programme faculty are all internationally renowned professors whose teaching methodology goes beyond the traditional forms of teaching to ensure a balanced and well-rounded learning experience. Personalised tutoring is also available for students to enjoy a more individual learning experience.

The curriculum follows the European ECTS system and the degree is awarded by Sorbonne University in Paris.

Admission requirements

To be eligible for this Bachelor's degree, students must have the following:

- French Baccalaureate with a minimum final average of 12/20 or High School Diploma with a minimum 80% average (or equivalent)*.
- French Aptitude Certificate: minimum score of B2 level (accepted certificates: DU issued by Sorbonne University, DELF, TEF, TCF and SELFEE). Students with a French Baccalaureate are exempted from the language proficiency exam**.
- *Students not meeting this requirement may be accepted following a review of high school subject results, supporting exams scores and a student's personal statement.
- **Students not meeting the required French Aptitude Certificate will be admitted conditionally in the programme, subject to passing a Foundation Programme in the French Language (French Intensive Course).

Career prospects

The degree prepares students for careers in governmental and non-governmental organisations, polling agencies, market research and statistics companies, diplomatic services, journalism and communication, secondary and higher education, consulting as well as human resources.

This curriculum offers access to numerous Masters' programmes worldwide in the fields of international relations, public policy, international affairs, law, human resources, communication, journalism, sociology and philosophy. Students can also pursue their studies at Sorbonne Abu Dhabi by applying to the Master in Applied Sociological Research.
