

ALI KASHWANI, is a 25-year old Emirati artist

from Sharjah who holds a bachelor degree in design management and is currently enrolled in Sorbonne University Abu Dhabi's Master in History of Art and Museum Studies. Since 2012, Ali conducted art workshops and he also participated in over 60 events and exhibitions nationally and has worked with several cultural institutions including Abu Dhabi Culture, Dubai Culture, Sharjah Art Foundation, Louvre Abu Dhabi, Dubai Expo 2020, Cultural Foundation, Watani Foundation, Dubai Calendar and others.

In addition, Ali Kashwani represented the UAE internationally when he was competing for the UAE in the Painting and Decoration category at the WorldSkills Abu Dhabi 2017. He has also won first place at Emirates Skills 2017 and the Dubai Sketch Battle 2019.

Ali Kashwani's art style is inspired by different art movements and styles throughout history such as 1920's art nouveau, post impressionism, and modern Arab art movements. Ali Kashwani's paintings often focus on people, the human experience and he gets his inspiration from his Arabian culture, environment and heritage.

It was mentioned in your bio that you tell stories through your artworks, what kind of stories are you interested in telling?

When creating an artwork, I find it interesting when the artwork has a story that would take the viewer on a journey. One of my main inspirations for this approach is Arabic poetry. For centuries, our ancestors painted the most wonderful images and took their listeners on great journeys using only words. In my artworks, I try to essentially "paint poetry".

What is the role of an artist in the society, from your point of view?

When I enrolled in the Master of History in Art and started taking classes, I've realised that one can fully understand and appreciate past cultures through their art. Therefore, the artists' role in society is not restricted to creating meaningful works of art for the world today, but it is also to preserve the heritage of the artist's own culture for future generations.

What's your favorite artwork and why?

I do not have a single favorite artwork due to the fact that each artwork appeals to a different perspective of my personality. However, I am mainly inspired by early 20th century artists and art movements such as Post-Impressionism and Art Nouveau and artists such as, Gustave Klimt and Alphonse Mucha.

Professionally, what's your goal? And what are your future goals as an artist?

As an artist, I would like to create artworks that would be a part of the long lasting 'history of art' that could serve as a pivotal point in the history of art of our region.

Who supported you through your journey as an artist?

Family. The first and foremost supporters of my aspirations and ambitions as an artist were my family.

Why did you choose to study History of Art and Museum Studies?

Since I was young, I was always interested in art, history, and culture, and through my studies in History of Art, I had the opportunity to learn in depth about different artists, and to get a glimpse of their personality and the different challenges and triumphs they went through. This, I believe, helped me grow as a person and therefore as an artist.

FACE TO FACE with Dr Karine Germoni

• Tell us more about your background and studies.

First of all, I wanted to study business and I even enrolled in the prestigious preparatory year of HEC Paris after my high-school diploma. However, I've always been fond of literature and philosophy, and this is the reason behind me choosing to study French, Latin and Greek literature. After my "Agrégation" in French classic literature, I did my PhD on punctuations in Samuel Beckett's bilingual work.

What encouraged you to join Sorbonne University Abu Dhabi?

I have joined Sorbonne Université in Paris as an associate professor in 2014 and I was very wellwelcomed. I loved working with my colleagues at the Department of French Language at the university. I personally love challenges and exploring new things, so when I had the opportunity to apply for this job in Abu Dhabi as a Head of French Studies Department and acting as Head of French as Foreign Language Department, I did not hesitate. Going to a Foreign country and working in a university where French language is the official language was something of great interest to me, especially that I also knew that I could work with various French institutions such as the French embassy, Alliance Française Abu Dhabi and Lycée Français to promote French language, French culture and literature. Relocating to another country and building a life there from scratch is not easy but it is definitely worth it.

• How did you find living and working in Abu Dhabi so far and Sorbonne University Abu Dhabi in particular?

When I first arrived to Abu Dhabi, it wasn't easy especially because of the Covid crisis. I wasn't used to the hot weather, and I had to stay in quarantine in a hotel with an electronic wristwatch. The paperwork was also difficult but this is a common situation for anyone relocating to a foreign country. What surprised me was the city's architecture, such as the various palaces and tall buildings. I was under the impression that I was in a fictional city because it's very different from the old architecture style that you find in France. I was also a bit worried to miss the vegetation, greenery scenes, and the Seine river that used to be in my surroundings. But step by step, I started discovering Abu Dhabi more and more especially the parks, and I was surprised by how green it is, despite difficult weather and environmental conditions. In addition to that, driving around was a bit of a challenge at the beginning, as I felt that all streets looked the same, but then, I realized that the city is built like an American one, in a geometrical pattern, which made it actually easier for me to navigate through. I do enjoy the weather here; it is like an eternal summer between October an April. I also appreciate the coexistence of many different communities and cultures. Although I am still new here and still exploring, yet I feel more and more positive about this every day.

• Why did you choose teaching French language and literature?

As my PhD was about punctuations, that led me to teach French language, grammar and stylistics. I'm a stylistics researcher, who works with linguistic tools, and with high sense of literature. Researching Beckett's work, an Irish author who chose France as a home and French as a writing language, is what really motivated me to specialize in French as a foreign language. As a result, I feel I'm in the right place heading the French and French as a Foreign Language Departments.

The Bachelor in French Literature prepares students to be either teachers of French language and French literature, journalists or prepares them for other careers in communications. The programme delivers many courses not only in literature, but also in French language grammar, style and courses in communication, this allows students who have passed this programme to work in many fields beside the mainstream paths of teaching and researching. It's important to understand that students

who study French literature will gain analytic skills that they can use in many other fields. For example, I know many of my students want to be politicians and this is where communication and the right usage of words is essential.

I like to repeat to my students "whoever master words can master the world". Communication is the main starting point and the key to all our professional and personal relationships. When words are not well understood, they lead to misperceptions, but without words, no successful communication is possible. Words are a very powerful tool, so mastering the science of words is owning a treasure and in fact, the way to get there is by studying French and foreign literature. by reading stories, whether fictional or bios, you can live many lives beside yours and discover other universes and feel various emotions. It indeed expands your empathy. Literature makes things more humane and it opens multiple doors towards the other places.

• What is your teaching style?

When I start the class, I remind my students of several binding rules to follow for a smooth lecture. It is important to work in an environment of mutual respect and positivity as well as in a constructive way. I invite my students to speak freely, to express their doubts or disagreement, and to also propose an alternative perspective. I ask them to act as adults, and to act and react in a professional way. One must justify his or her disagreement or understanding and be able to propose an alternative perspective. Most importantly, studying in class involves learning how to learn.

Last, I ask my students to turn off their cell phones and I do the same. It's a matter of politeness and it enables students to focus during class. I always tell my students that I'm the captain of the boat and they are my sailors; a captain cannot do anything without his or her sailors and vice versa! However, the Covid crisis revealed how interactions between professors and students are precious. Delivering the courses behind a screen without knowing whether students are listening or if they are present is not an easy thing. Not knowing if students were receptive was a big worry for me, especially that students turn their cameras off. It is difficult indeed, especially that teachers are constantly concerned whether students are being attentive or not. I really hope things get back to normal as I think e-learning can be a good solution for exceptional cases only. However, e-learning can damage social links. Indeed, physical communication is very important in the different phases of the learning process.

What careers can students enrolled in the French as a Foreign Language Programme pursue? Do you have any advice for them?

Students enrolled in the Bachelor in French Literature and Master in Teaching French as a Foreign Language can pursue careers in various fields such as teaching and research, communications and journalism, publishing, cultural sector, government and public services, leisure and tourism, travel industry, business management and human resources.

I advise my students to do what they are passionate about, what makes one wake up in the morning! I also advise them to highlight all the skills that their degree gives them so they can transfer their skills from one sector to the other and evolve in their career throughout their life.

• Are you working on any projects and can you tell us about it?

In connection with my research on autography and my focus on correcting autography and with the four Dictées I have organised at Sorbonne Université in Paris with my amazing colleagues, I'm planning to organsie a dictée here at Sorbonne University Abu Dhabi during the French language week, most probably in March. This event will be co-organised with the French school Lycée Louis Massignon (Hans Limon) and Rachid Santaki, organizer of the giant Dictée. The idea is to have a dictation with different levels of difficulty as we will include 3 to 4 categories to allow different people to participate in this competition. The aim of this dictée is to gather French language lovers, French speakers and Francophiles. Moreover, we are planning to organise the French Day with UAE University. It is very important for me that the University is embedded in the city and that it remains open to the world so that it disseminates research activities and make it understandable to the community.

As for research, I'm currently working on the republishing of Maurice Grevisse's book 'Le français correct' with the publishing house DeBoeck.

In the near future, I would also like to organise a colloquium on writing in French as a foreign and secondary language. It is important to remember that French is spoken in numerous countries but it is even more important to question why some non-French authors chose French as their writing language.

• How do you spend your free time?

I don't have enough free time. One of my new year resolutions is to do sports as I love swimming,walking and dancing. We should never forget the Latin quote that says "Mens sana in corpore sano" which means "a healthy mind in a healthy body". One of my other resolutions is to continue discovering the UAE and other middle-eastern countries. I am passionate about travelling too.

PEER TUTORING PROGRAMME OF THE STUDENT SUCCESS & WELLBEING SECTION

Since a new hybrid learning system has begun, many students might face difficulties. Virtual and in campus peer tutors are now available to help students.

Peer Tutoring is a programme that aims at helping students and assist them with their academic concerns by assigning high achieving senior students, known as peer tutors, who were enrolled in similar academic programme as the one that the new students are enrolled in, to support and guide them through their educational journey.

The Peer Tutoring programme is not designed to teach a student the course material from the beginning, but to strengthen their abilities in the course by giving them tricks and tips to excel further and provide a constant support.

The physical tutoring sessions take place in the library or in assigned classrooms, while using Microsoft Teams and other interactive virtual tools for the virtual lessons.

Tutoring sessions are held either in groups or individually based on the students' requirements. Each peer tutor is chosen by the Student Success and Wellbeing team based on a sound academic standing and his or her engagement with campus life. A student is also assigned to a tutor by the Student Success and Wellbeing team to ensure quality and non-biasness in the selection.

All peer tutors are multilingual, culturally aware and academically sound to provide students with the same material that they have studied and excelled in.
