Master in Teaching French as a Foreign Language

The Master in Teaching French as a Foreign Language is the only programme of its kind in the United Arab Emirates. It enables students to learn the necessary skills to teach French worldwide and especially in Arab speaking regions. The programme also delivers the necessary knowledge to work in the fields of creation and marketing of products related to the French language (in economy or tourism).

This high-level programme targets students wishing to perfect their skills in the field of French culture and language, with the aim of becoming a teacher of French as a Foreign Language or to work in a structure developing programmes in French language. The French language is spoken by more than 300 million people and is the official language of 29 countries and international or regional organisations such as the European Union. With a 2.2% annual population growth, the francophone world is the most dynamic linguistic space in the world. The French language skills developed by the students during this programme will become a growing valuable professional asset in the next decades.

Depending on the background of the candidate, the master programme can be taken in 1 or 2 years. During these years, students deepen their knowledge in the fields of French language and culture, didactics, interculturality, comparing French language with other languages and in particular with the Arabic language (contrastive linguistics).

During the last semester, students do an internship to gain professional experience and complete their university education.

Students develop their skills through projects, workshops and constant dialogue with their teachers and colleagues.

The courses are taught by professors from Sorbonne Université, whom are internationally acclaimed in the field of French language and Teaching French as a Foreign Language (FLE). This programme is the only existing one outside France that equals the Master LFA taught in Paris.

All courses are taught in French and refresher courses in French language can be taken before starting the programme.

The Master Teaching French as a Foreign Language is taught in French and spans across 4 semesters over 2 years. Classes are taught in the evening to allow working professionals to combine their professional and study schedules.

Internship

Students not yet having work experience in the field of Teaching French as a Foreign Language will have to take a mandatory internship during the second semester of each year.

These internships nurture the development of critical thinking and enhance the student's skills by allowing him to apply the acquired knowledge into the professional world.

Students must submit an internship report.

Assessment & graduation Requirements

Throughout the year, there will be frequent assessments and evaluations. Students will be evaluated on individual assignments, presentations, reports and examinations and internship reports to be submitted towards the end of the semester.

Attendance to all classes is mandatory and it is important that students are punctual and observe university regulations at all times.





Career prospects

Graduates from the Master in Teaching French as a Foreign Language can apply for teaching positions in middle school, high school and at a university level. They can also apply for professional training positions in the tourism, culture and health sectors. In addition, they can apply for positions in cultural and diplomatic services in francophone countries, or for administrative positions in public and private institutions.

They can also pursue a career in companies specialised in marketing of editorial products that promote the French language and culture throughout the world. These opportunities are rich in the UAE and in other countries of the Middle East, as they have important cultural relations with France.

Admission to the master programmes is selective and competitive and each applicant will be considered on his/her own merit. The admissions process ensures that every course has an ideal mix of people with talent, impressive interpersonal skills and a positive attitude.

Admission requirements

General entry requirements:

Candidates must complete an online application and upload the following items:

- A copy of the bachelor degree earned in a discipline appropriate for the programme
- A copy of the high school diploma
- A detailed curriculum vitae*
- A personal statement (not exceeding one page)
- A French aptitude certificate (DELF, SELFEE, TCF or TEF (B2 level minimum). French command is mandatory.
- Official academic transcripts, official test scores

Shortlisted candidates might be asked to attend an interview to assess the candidate's motivations, career expectations and relevant professional experience in the degree area.

International applicants are required to present an equivalency of their degree from the UAE Ministry of Education located in Abu Dhabi. For details on the requirements, visit the website: <https://www.moe.gov.ae>
