Programme Overview

The Master in Archaeology and Cultural Heritage was developed to cater to the need of addressing current challenges in the field of Archaeology, which is at the core of other disciplines including earth sciences, materials science, digital technologies, conservation sciences etc.., and therefore offers broader professional opportunities for the programme's graduates. It is designed to cover the areas of Archaeology, Heritage, and other related disciplines, hence, provides students with a 360-degree overview of these fields. This programme is multidisciplinary, yet, it gives priority to Archaeology and Heritage with particular focus on the challenges faced in Abu Dhabi and the Emirates in general.

Its unique curriculum and mode of delivery, with each semester alternating between lectures and fieldwork practice (internship), reflects on the scholarly and practical nature of archaeological and heritage work. In Fall Semesters, lessons are delivered by local and visiting professors, including museum professionals, archaeologists, geologists, scientists such as physicists who are also specialists in their fields. In Spring Semesters, in the first year students will participate in an Academic Archaeological Project in the Emirate of Dubai which is developed by the Department of Archaeology and History of Art of Sorbonne University Abu Dhabi, while in their second year, students will conduct their mandatory internship in partners institutions, in the UAE or abroad (depending on the level of language proficiency of the candidates).

Students will therefore have the opportunity to acquire broad, deep knowledge and practical skills in Archaeology and Heritage both on the field and in labs, this is complimented with a scientific background strong enough to develop their critical thinking and to providing them with innovative problem solving skills to analyse, preserve and manage archaeological/historical sites as well as culture material.

The Master Degree Programme in Archaeology and Cultural Heritage aims to train competent professionals in the areas of Archaeology and Cultural Heritage management, conservation, and valorization to face the new challenges and the technological revolution that such fields are currently experiencing. Graduates of this programme will be able to support not only the immediate needs of museums and cultural organizations, heritage collections and sites, but will also, be able to provide cutting-edge solutions to managing and preserving them in the medium and long run. The programme is delivered by visiting professors coming from the Department of History of Art and Archaeology at Sorbonne University (Paris) and professors from Sorbonne University Abu Dhabi, as well as archaeologists, museum professionals, geomaticians, geographers, and scientists working in the field of Heritage.

It provides an overview of the different material traditions in South- eastern Asia from the bronze age to the end of the medieval period. The course includes a presentation of the specific methodology and tools used in tropical area and of the new technologies applied to archaeology. This course includes case-studies (the research of Yaśovarman I's monasteries in Cambodia: 9th-10th c.) and research programs dedicated to stone, metal and ceramics during the Angkorian period: 9th-14th c.) to present the different steps of an archaeological research program, from the theoretical questions (research questions or problematics) to the surveys and excavation, and then to the analysis, dating, interpretation and preservation of the collected artefacts.

	Each lesson consists of a lecture followed by an interactive problem-based

	(within an excavation team or a museum team). An assessment of the
	solutions offered is then discussed.
	The students are thus put in a real situation, manipulating tools (virtual
	analysis of X-ray scanners of museum objects and realization of 3D
	photogrammetry) by alternating theoretical presentation (technical instruments
	and their challenges) and practice around concrete case-studies.
	Advances in 3D digital imaging resulting, especially from scanners and
	industrial imaging (CT scans), providing access to invisible information
	(which was already done by other imaging techniques, foremost among which
	is the RX) are fundamental. The major upheaval comes from the possibility of
	remotely manipulating the object -such as an archaeological sample or a museum piece. to "out it up" and engly a it without destroying it. To use the
