


GRADUATES NATIONALITY










Figure 3 Graduates by Gender

















Figure 10 Job Seeking Breakdown

The data in Figure 3 indicates that 90% of graduates were female.



Figure 1 Total Graduates over the Years







Figure 6 Graduates by Employment Sector








Figure 1 Total Graduates over the Years




Figure 8 Employment Status While Studying




Figure 9 Further Studies Statistics









Figure 1 Total Graduates over the Years





Figure 7 Employment by Nafis Benefits






Figure 5 Graduates by Employment Status










Figure 8 Employment Status While Studying






Figure 1 Total Graduates over the Years






Figure 3 Graduates by Gender





Figure 7 Employment by Nafis Benefits







Figure 9 Further Studies Statistics






Figure 9 Further Studies Statistics






Figure 3 Graduates by Gender








Employment Status While Studying












Figure 1 Total Graduates over the Years




Figure 5 Graduates by Employment Status




Figure 9 Further Studies Statistics




Figure 1 Total Graduates over the Years








Figure 5 Graduates by Employment Status












Figure 9 Further Studies Statistics






Figure 1 Total Graduates over the Years




















Figure 9 Further Studies Statistics




Figure 7 Employment by Nafis Benefits






Figure 3 Graduates by Gender

















Figure 10 Job Seeking Breakdown













Figure 2 illustrates the nationalities of graduates for the academic year 2023/24, including representation from the UAE and the Czech Republic.






